Meditation

Resting in Silence

Contemplative Prayer is a Way to Love, a path and practice that enables us to love. In Contemplative Prayer we are asking for Love, to be able to receive and give Love. We begin by asking with our own body, sensing our own body here and now. We descend into the region of the heart, with our attention directed towards our heart. From this place, we breathe deeply and pray. If it helps, use a sacred word to help you descend into this silence (such as Beloved, Shalom, Mercy, Abba, Jesus, or Spirit) or a breath prayer, such as "Lord" (inhale) "have mercy" (exhale). If a thought, feeling, or sensation tries to take you away from this interior place, don't "hold on" to it – simply and gently release it by returning to your sacred word or breath prayer.
