Seeing with Julian

Our Lord showed me a spiritual sight of his familiar love. I saw that our Lord is to us everything which is good and comforting for our help. He is our clothing, who wraps and enfolds us for love, embraces us and shelters us, surrounds us for his love, which is so tender that he may never desert us. And so in this sight I saw that he is everything which is good, as I understand.

And in this he showed me something small, no bigger than a hazelnut, lying in the palm of my hand, and I perceived that it was as round as any ball. I looked at it and thought: What can this be? And I was given this general answer: It is everything which is made. I was amazed that it could last, for I thought that it was so little that it could suddenly fall into nothing. And I was answered in my understanding: It lasts and always will, because God loves it, and thus everything has being through the love of God.

In this little thing I saw three properties. The first is that God made it, the second is that God loves it, the third is that God preserves it. But what did I see in it? It is that God is the Maker and the Keeper and the Lover. For until I am substantially united to him, I can never have full rest or true bliss, until, that is, I am so attached to him that there can be no created thing between my God and me.

God chose to be our Mother in all things and so made the foundation of his work, most humbly and most pure, in the Virgin's womb. God, the perfect Wisdom of all, arrayed himself in this humble place. Christ came in our poor flesh to share a mother's care. *Christ carried us within him in love and travail, until the full time of his passion.* And when all was completed, he had carried us so for joy. Still all this could not satisfy the power of his wonderful love. All that we owe is redeemed in truly loving God, for the love of Christ works in us; Christ is the One whom we love. Christ revealed our frailty and our falling, our trespasses and our humiliations. Christ also revealed his blessed power, his blessed wisdom and love. *He protects us as tenderly and as sweetly when we are in greatest need;* he raises us in spirit and turns everything to glory and joy without ending. God is the ground and the substance, the very essence of nature; God is the true Father and Mother of natures. We are all bound to God by nature, and we are all bound to God by grace. And this grace is for all the world, because it is our precious Mother, Christ. Our true Mother Jesus, he alone bears us for joy and for endless life. Blessed may he be! The mother can give her child to suck of her milk, but our precious Mother Jesus can feed us with himself, and does so, most courteously and most tenderly with this blessed sacrament, which is the precious food of true life. Our tender Mother Jesus can lead us easily into his blessed breast, and show us there a part of the Godhead and of the joys of heaven. And he does so with these words: "See how I love you. I protect you very safely." So He wants us to act as a meek child, saying thus: "My kind Mother, my gracious Mother, my beloved Mother, have mercy on me."
