The Promised One Comes

In many times and many ways in the past, God has spoken to the ancestors in the prophets. In these last days, God spoke to us in a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom also he made the worlds. Deliver me from my fear of taking the next risky step. Heal my need to control the future.

The only security I need is your Presence.

For my heart's desire is to walk with you into the days ahead. Walk with me and show me how to do that. Give me your Spirit as a Guide along this path you have invited me to walk. And when the time comes, give me the grace to soar.

We are the waiting place of rest, where You are born in us in time, and we in You eternally. This mystery of Christmas is where God and humankind unite as One – one mind, one heart, one body, one breath. One bread, one wine, one thirst, one drink of satisfaction from the cup of life.

Expectant and in hope we grow in You and You in us. We know this secret from within the soul, by listening and by living. By longing for new births along the Way, we sense the Kingdom of God within us, striving to emerge from the womb of our heart.

So now we wait in pain, in joy, in hope, despair, in desperation and in need. In this good Darkness we dare to risk Your pregnancy of Light, for You are ever with us from within.

O God, Emmanuel, come near at last to birth us into Light. We fling wide the portals of our hearts. We are Your Temple, Your People, Your Priests to You and to the world. Fill us now with Your Presence and reveal Your Grace and Love in and through us.

Now we take and eat, we lift and drink, in deep remembrance of You whose Way becomes for us the secret that now stirs within, and comes to birth within us as sacrament and Spirit-blessed, new food, new light, a taste that ignites in all the longing to return to You, our True Source and Home.

The Way of The Anchorite: Towards a Three-Fold Rule of Life

Thursdays, January 9, 16, 23, 30 | The Anchor House | 6:00 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. In this new class offered by Michael, students will be led through a simple model for developing a "Rule" or "Way" of Life. This model is inspired by the monastic tradition of the "anchorite" – someone who withdrew from distractions to deepen their relationship with God, others, and the created world. To aid them, they committed themselves to certain practices that helped them to more consciously be anchored: in God, to Church, and for the World. In this 4-week class,

Michael will help you determine what are your obstacles and facilitating conditions for anchoring in God, anchoring to Community, and being an anchoring presence in your World.
